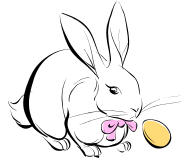

## Grand Traverse Rural Fire Department Battalion 4 Green lake Township EMS

It is that time of year again when many of us will be conducting spring cleaning around our homes and yards. Many people dispose of their household waste by burning. The Michigan Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Environmental Quality are the agencies that regulate and permit open burning in the state. If you intend to burn any waste materials, please observe the following guidelines to insure safety and promote clean air.

1. Ordinary household waste may be burned in a metal or masonry container, such as a barrel, provided it is covered with a screen. Ordinary waste is defined as that which is produced in one or two family dwellings such as paper or cardboard. Commercial or industrial waste may not be burned in Michigan. State law also prohibits the burning of construction or demolition waste including all lumber whether it is treated or untreated. Also prohibited is the burning of hazardous materials such as paint, chemicals or tires.

2. Open burning of yard waste is permitted by the DNR. This means natural materials such as grass clippings, brush, logs, trees, leaves or stumps. If snow completely covers the ground – no permit is needed. However, after the snow melts you must call the DNR at 1-800-922-2876 or check on line to see if burning is permitted in your area. The fire department does not issue permits.

3. Remember that you are responsible for the safety and security of your fire. Obtaining a permit does not exempt you from citations should your fire escape. Under recent changes to the Michigan Open Burning Law, you could be found guilty of a felony if your fire escapes and destroys another person's property. Follow these safety tips when burning;

- \*Burn in a safe container with draft holes measuring 3/4" minimum
- \*Burn in a safe area, at least 15' from buildings with 10' of bare earth all around
- \*Burn early or late in the day when humidity is up and the wind is down
- \*NEVER leave fire unattended – It's the Law!
- \*Keep children away
- \*Keep a hose, shovel or rake handy for emergencies
- \*Never burn unsafe materials such as aerosol cans or explosives.

Recycling can be a good alternative to burning. Please call the fire station or DNY if you have any questions concerning outdoor burning.

Also remember that National EMS Week will be Observed May 15-21<sup>st</sup> -Look for Open Houses and other interesting activities at the fire station that week.

## Past Times in Interlochen

### A Boyhood Scare

I was raised in the little red house across from Green Lake Township Hall. It is hard to see now because of the growth of trees which, most of them, I had planted over the years. It is one of the oldest homes in Interlochen. In 1934, I remember one warm humid summer night crawling out of bed, going downstairs and outside to get a breath of air and cool off. Being brave, (I thought), I got off the porch and decided to take a little walk towards the old Town Hall. That was a mistake because the night was moonless with thick overhead clouds. It was dark – really dark. I could not see my hand in front of my face. I decided to turn around and go back. After roaming around for quite sometime and not finding my house, I knew I was lost.

At that period of time, there was no electric. People only had kerosene lamps. It was late and everyone in town had put out their lamps. There was no reflective light from the street lamps or yard lights to get my bearing from either. I panicked (brave me). I could not find my way back and I didn't bump into anything familiar that could help guide me. What seemed hours later, I heard my mother's voice calling me and discovered I was only a couple hundred feet from home, What a relief!

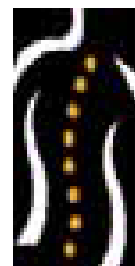

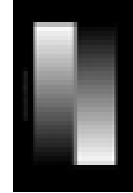
